Electricity, Gas, Water and Waste Services




Of the 13,600 employers that responded to Victorian Employer Skills Survey in 2018, 80 were from the Electricity, Gas, Water and Waste Services industry. Employers report that skills are important to productivity, but many are facing challenges filling jobs and finding the right applicants with the right skills. These challenges are faced both now, and are expected to continue into the future. However, a high proportion of employers that access training to improve the skills of their workforce report a positive impact on productivity and return on investment. Training providers engaged in this industry are seen to be of very high quality.

The statistics below reflect the experience of employers in the Electricity, Gas, Water and Waste Services industry compared to the overall Victorian average.
