# **Application for an Authority to Control Wildlife**

All native animals (birds, mammals, reptiles and frogs) are protected in Victoria under the *Wildlife Act 1975*. It is illegal to wilfully disturb, trap or kill wildlife without a permit and may result in a fine and/or imprisonment.

You may apply for an Authority to Control Wildlife (ATCW) permit to disturb (scare) disperse, trap or kill wildlife if it is:

- · damaging buildings, pasture, crops or other property;
- posing a risk to human health and safety; or
- · impacting on biodiversity

and you are either the:

- owner;
- occupier; or
- · administrator of the affected property

#### Before you apply for an ATCW

There are a number of ways to manage wildlife damage that do not require an ATCW, for example fencing or compliant netting to exclude animals. An application for the lethal control of wildlife will only be considered when all practical non-lethal options have been considered. More information about non-lethal and lethal control methods can be found in the ATCW form guidance.

An ATCW is not required to control Eastern or Western Grey Kangaroos if you use a Kangaroo Harvest Program (KHP) authorised harvester. Landholders are required to register with Services Victoria who will provide a list of authorised harvesters working in your area. It is then up to you to contact a harvester. The KHP ensures the harvesting is ecologically sustainable, humane, only undertaken by people who have been authorised to do so and enables the use of carcasses pet food production. Applicants are encouraged to complete an ATCW application online. The online form includes links to assist you with completing your property details and will ensure that all required information has been included which will help reduce processing times. #### Processing time and causes for delay

Allow up to 6 weeks for your ATCW to be processed. Your application will be assessed by a DELWP officer who may inspect your property to confirm the wildlife issues. To ensure your application is processed as quickly as possible:

- make sure your application is complete and legible;
- provide as much detail as possible to support your application, including photos if they are relevant;
- send your application via email.

Incomplete applications will not be assessed until all required information has been supplied.

#### Review of the decision

If you are not satisfied with the decision made by DELWP, you can apply to the Victorian Civil Administrative Tribunal (VCAT) for a review within 28 days. See <a href="https://www.vcat.vic.gov.au/">https://www.vcat.vic.gov.au/</a>.

#### ATCW expiry and renewal

Authorities to Control Wildlife have an expiry date and are not able to be renewed. Each application is individually assessed against many factors, including the local and broader environmental context. If you have been issued an ATCW in the past, keep in mind that your application for a similar activity will not be automatically approved.

#### Additional obligations

There are other requirements you might need to meet before controlling wildlife, even if you have been issued an ATCW. These include following local municipal bylaws and other legislation relating to the use of firearms or the disposal of carcasses. More information can be found in the ATCW form guidance.


