

This book is about the meeting for the **Disability Inclusion Profile**.



The Disability Inclusion Profile helps us know how to support your child better at school.



We call it the profile.



This book tells you what happens at the profile meeting.



What is the profile about?


The profile will tell us

• what your child can do well at school



• what support your child gets at school

• whether your school can get **funding**.




Funding is money your school gets to give extra support to your child.




What is a profile meeting?

A profile meeting is where we complete the profile with you and your child.



The profile meeting will take about 90 minutes.



The profile meeting will help us collect the information we need.



Before the meeting

You need to give **consent** before we can collect your child's information.



Consent means you say **yes**.



You can decide if you want your child to take part.




You can say

• yes

or



• no.



How will we use your information?

We will only collect the information we need to support your child at school.



We will keep your child's information private.



Private means we will **not** share your child's information with other people unless

• you say we can



or

• the law says we have to.





The people at the profile meeting will include

Who will be at the profile meeting?

- you and your child
- the teacher



• the principal



other people who work with your child
for example, a psychologist.



The same people might also attend a **Student Support Group** or SSG.



The SSG helps students with disability get the right support at school.



Who will run the meeting?

The person who runs the meeting is called the **facilitator**.


The facilitator



 helps the group agree on what support your child needs



- is trained
- does **not** work for your school.



You can ask a support person to come to the profile meeting with you.

Can you bring a support person?

For example, an **advocate**.

An advocate can help you

- understand information
- say what you want
- make decisions.

If you need help with English, we can get an **interpreter** to come to the meeting.

An interpreter is a person who can

- speak your language
- help you understand English.



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How can your child take part in the profile meeting?


Your child can join the profile meeting

• in person

or




 by communicating what they want to say to someone they trust.



We will help your child join the meeting in the way they want.

Your child can communicate to us what they think in different ways.





• a video



• a photo

• a drawing.



How can you prepare for the profile meeting?

You can use the **Parent Voice Tool** to help prepare for the profile meeting.

The Parent Voice Tool is a form you can fill in with your school.



You can ask your school for more information about the Parent Voice Tool.

What will happen at the profile meeting?



The facilitator will ask

- what your child can do
- what your child's goals are
- what helps your child learn at school.

The meeting will also talk about **levels of adjustment**.



Levels of adjustment means how much support your child needs at school.



You can

- ask questions at any time
- say if you do **not** understand something.



Your school will get a report

The facilitator will write a report after the profile meeting.



The report will be about what people said at the meeting.




Your school will get a copy of the report.



Your school will talk to you about the report.

What will happen next?



Your child will likely need 2 or 3 profiles during their school years.



The school will let you know when we need to complete another profile.



You will get a chance to go to more SSG meetings.

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The report will say how often the SSG meetings should happen.

If you are not happy with the outcome



An **outcome** is the decision we make after the profile meeting.



If you are **not** happy with the outcome of the profile meeting you can talk to

• your child's teacher



Your school can ask us to **review** the outcome.



Review means we check if the outcome is fair.
