Information for barred persons who wish to request a review to change or cancel their barring order

Under section 1061 of the *Liquor Control Reform Act 1998*, if you are issued a barring order, you can request the person who issued the order to change or cancel it.

LCV also has the power to change or cancel a barring order.

Please note that the power to review is not intended to operate as a general appeals process. Instead, this power will be used sparingly to make minor changes to barring orders such as an incorrect name or wrong address. LCV may also consider reducing the duration of the barring order.

In order to make an informed decision about changing or cancelling the barring order, LCV will contact the person who issued the order to find out why it was issued, and if any attempt to change or cancel the barring order has been previously requested.

The barred person **must** attach a copy of the barring order to the 'review request'. If the barring order cannot be located, the barred person should ask for a copy from the person who issued the order. Depending on the request the following information will assist the decision to change or cancel the barring order:

- a statutory declaration that the barred person has been unsuccessful in their attempt to have the barring order changed or cancelled by the person who issued the order
- a statutory declaration that the person identified in the barring order was not present at the time the barring order was issued, and a further statutory declaration by a person to confirm that the person identified in the barring order was with them and not at the licensed premises
- any other supporting information to support the request.
