Remote seller's licences don't need planning permission

You must submit this document to Liquor Control Victoria with your application for a new, variation or relocation of a remote seller's licence.

Proof that your application complies with the planning scheme

This document is your proof that your application complies with the Victorian planning scheme.

As at 14 January 2025 a remote seller's licence does not need a planning permit under the Victorian planning scheme.

You cannot use this as proof of compliance with planning for any other licence category.

Why do I have to submit it with my application?

Most liquor licence applications must provide planning permission. This is required under the Liquor Control Reform Regulations 2023.

Providing this document with your application will help you meet your legal requirements when lodging an application with LCV.

More specifically, it can be used to meet the following regulations:

- Regulation 14(1)(b)(ii) for new remote seller's licence applications.
- Regulation 16(b)(ii) for variations of an existing remote seller's licence.
- Regulation 18(1) for relocations of an existing remote seller's licence.

How do I have to submit this document to LCV?
