

Understanding your liquor licence

1. The licence is valid until the end of each calendar year.
2. This is the holder of the licence. The licensee can be a company, partnership, individual or incorporated association.
3. This is your postal address. Keep it up to date via your [Liquor Portal account](#).
4. This is the name your business trades under. Please notify LCV of any changes at contact@liquor.vic.gov.au.
5. As well as your general obligations, there may be conditions listed on the licence that are unique to your venue. It is an offence not to comply with these conditions.
6. This shows the days and hours alcohol can be supplied. Note: Customers have 30 minutes to finish supplied drinks after the end of trading hours (no alcohol is to be sold during this time).

GENERAL INFORMATION

A liquor licence does not override local laws, planning schemes and conditions on planning permits. It is the responsibility of the licensee to ensure they comply with these and all conditions of a planning permit above what is specified on the liquor licence. Where the trading hours on your planning permit are less than the trading hours on this liquor licence, you must comply with the hours on the planning permit.

Any reference to the Liquor Regulator below is a reference to the Victorian Liquor Commission, or any successor statutory office, body or officer however named, under the Liquor Control Reform Act 1998 or successor legislation, that has powers and carries out regulatory functions equivalent to the Victorian Liquor Commission.

TYPE OF LICENCE

This licence is an on-premises licence and authorises the licensee to supply liquor on the licensed premises for consumption on the licensed premises during the trading hours specified below.

AMENITY

The licensee shall not cause or permit undue detriment to the amenity of the area to arise out of or in connection with the use of the premises to which the licence relates during or immediately after the trading hours authorised under this licence.

MAXIMUM CAPACITIES

350 patrons.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

The windows facing Shelley Street are to be shut and remain shut after 9pm on any day.

7. Your current liquor licence or BYO permit must be displayed so the public can see it and read it.
8. When contacting LCV, please quote your licence number.
9. This is the actual location of your licensed premises.
10. A nominee is a person nominated by a licensee or permittee and approved by LCV. They assume the responsibilities and obligations of the licensee/permittee.
11. States the type of licence and what it can do.
12. You must ensure the operation of your business does not impact the amenity of an area. Amenity is the quality that the area has of being pleasant and agreeable.
13. You may apply to LCV for additional approvals on your licence. For example, you may have approval to supply alcohol in an additional area (footpath, external areas or off site).
